CSJs Continue To Support Desert Refuge for Peace Officers

Although law enforcement personnel recognize that stress is part of their professions and working conditions, our society has not always addressed their needs to relieve anxiety, depression and post traumatic disorder. The Desert Refuge for Peace Officers is a place of hospitality, healing and solitude for law enforcement personnel as well as active and retired military personnel and their families. The center, founded in 1999 by Father Michael McCullough, is located in Joshua Tree, CA. Sister Mary Ellen Sprouffske, CSJ (now retired) served on the board for many years and was "the best grant writer. She secured grants from friends and organizations to ensure that there would always be a center where officers and their families could develop skills to deal with burnout, deter suicide and find time to focus on their spiritual needs without the distractions of modern life," says Father Michael.

The Center continues to develop the land, provide food and counseling, and build a chapel on the grounds thanks to monetary donations and gifts such as a grant sent by our Community from the Dear Neighbor Fund.

CSJ Ministry Support Fund Grant Applications

The CSJ Ministry Support Fund provides grants to organizations that serve the poor and underserved. These grants are available to organizations where a Sister of St. Joseph or Associate serves directly (paid or volunteer) or as a member of the Board of Directors. An organization may receive a grant for three consecutive years, followed by a two-year hiatus. Organizations on hiatus are welcome to submit an application. Grant awards will depend on available funds. Applications are available on the Members Only website under forms. Please inform your organization of the application due date and give the application forms to the appropriate person. Completed applications are due September 15, 2017. A final report from 2016-2017 grant recipients is required for consideration for future grants.
