A New Beginning at Anna's House

Editor's Note:

Our Community awarded a grant from the Dear Neighbor Fund to help support Anna's Home. This fund offers grants to Sisters, Associates and Partners in Mission to help alleviate suffering and meet NEW unmet needs, with a preferential option for the poor.

"I had to lose everything, "says Yessenia reflecting on her journey to Anna's Home, a transitional sober living residence recently opened in Paso Robles (CA) by Restorative Partners for women and children. Sister Theresa Harpin, CSJ is the Executive Director and Julia Collins is the Program Coordinator. Yessenia had some problems with the law and was at risk of being incarcerated for a long time, but her desire to put her life together and regain custody of her youngest child, lead her to Anna's House after the facility where she lived closed. "I am ready to take my time to get well;

I am living in a supportive environment where I can achieve my goals." Sara is the House manager who makes sure that chores are done by the three residents, all women, one of them has children living with her. She also conducts random drug tests. "In exchange for rent, I make sure that everyone helps out. I am also working on my addiction counseling certification." Hopefully, Anna's Home will soon get a Drug and Alcohol County contract which will help supplement costs.

MSMU Nursing Faculty Staff Headed for Tanzania

Village Network Africa (ViNA) is a registered nonprofit organization committed to fighting rural village poverty in Africa. It focuses on collaborative relationships with village communities, government agencies and partner organizations to develop sustainable solutions for improved health, nutrition, infrastructure, education, economic and social conditions. ViNA is the brainchild of Anita Bolwing, who attended classes at the Mount, and her husband. Anita recently reached out to Leah FitzGerald, Dean of Nursing, and offered to assist with giving information and program materials and traveling with a faculty member to the site where they would teach health promotion/disease prevention and conduct needs assessments.

She reports that infant and maternal mortality is very high in the Simanjiro region of Tanzania. "Things moved very quickly and Dr. Gloria Nwagwu, one of our faculty from Nigeria, will be going the first of July. We received some support from our Global Initiative program and MSMU will fund the rest," said FitzGerald. "The plan is to continue this experience and next year bring a few students based on grant opportunities/funding."

Women and Heart Attacks (Myocardial Infarction/ MI)


You may have read this before, but life-saving advice is worth reading more than once!

Did you know that women rarely have the same dramatic symptoms that men have when experiencing heart attack? You know, the sudden stabbing pain in the chest, the cold sweat, grabbing the chest and dropping to the floor that we see in the movies?

Here is the story of one woman's experience (an ER nurse) with a heart attack. "I had a completely unexpected heart attack at about 10:30 pm with NO prior exertion; NO prior emotional trauma that one would suspect might've brought it on. I was sitting all snugly and warm on a cold evening, with my purring cat in my lap, reading an interesting story my friend had sent me, and actually thinking, "A-a-h, this is the life, all cozy and warm in my soft, cushy Lazy Boy with my feet propped up."
