Countdown to Our Christmas Boutique: 7 days left!

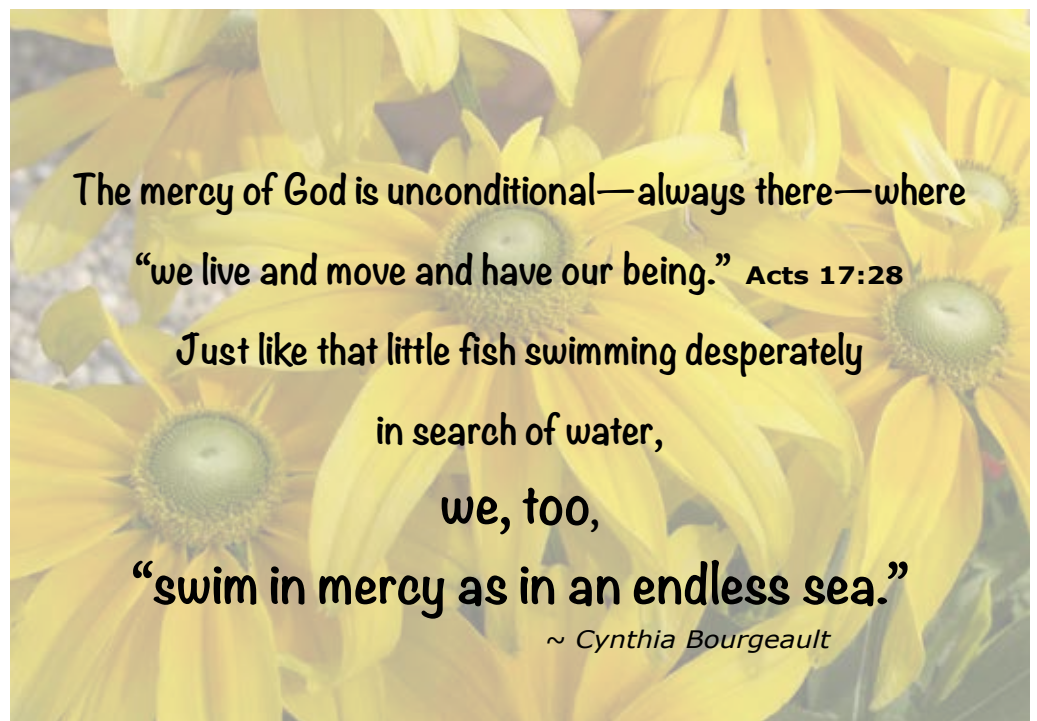
