We are happy to report that eight organizations received grants from our *Dear Neighbor Grant Fund* which come, in part, from our annual Hawaii Calls drawing and our Annual Angel Boutique. The funding was allocated as follows:

- \$2,500 Escuela de Lenguaje Raiguen (Chile) for the purchase of computers
- \$ 1,200 San Fernando Rescue Mission (Northridge, CA) for homeless individuals and families
- \$2,000 St. Elizabeth's Center (Tucson, AZ) for the Food Pantry program
- \$1,275 Catholic Chaplain's Office (Lynwood, CA) for worship aids
- \$2,500 UCARE (Los Angeles, CA) for the education and legal services for unaccompanied minors from Central America
- \$1,500 Circle the City (Phoenix, AZ) for affordable housing program in Maricopa County
- \$1,000 Catholic Charities (San Bernardino, CA) for counseling office improvements
- \$2,000 Healing Well (San Francisco, CA) for daily healing and wellness program

The Novitiate is Here

"Something New" is getting old hat, but something new is happening. The Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet, the Congregation of the great love of God, is opening a Congregational Novitiate, a novitiate house for the whole congregation.

For some time and in a few ways the Congregation has been moving to uniting various offices. In March 2018, the Congregation will unite in a single novitiate, with the Congregational Novitiate opening with co-directors, Sister Jeanne Marie Gocha from the Albany province and Sister Carol Brong from the L.A. province. Sisters Jeanne Marie and Carol will move into Caritas (our house in Porter Ranch) in February and begin to set up and continue their planning. With God's grace, Chizuru Yamada, a candidate from Japan and will begin her novitiate in late March, and two other candidates— Tracy Watson (Albany) and Sally Koch (L.A.) will join in summer 2018.

The two-year Congregational Novitiate Program will include the 10 month, canonical year Federation Novitiate (Rochester, New York) and a non-canonical year where it is hoped that the novices can experience the ministries and cultures of the other provinces. Both years include preparation for first vows. ❖
