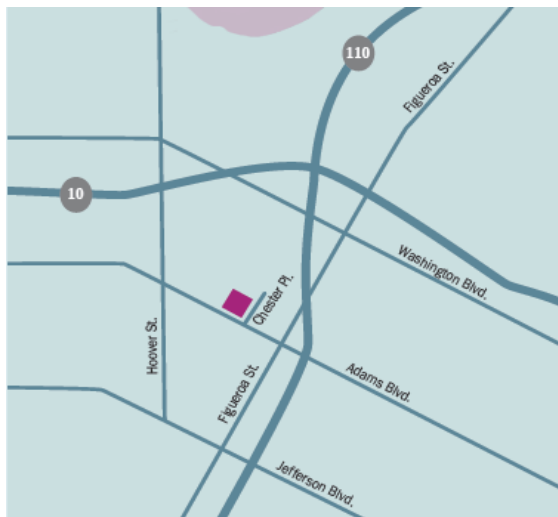

Red Lights & Price Tags: The Demand Side of Modern Slavery

Human slavery and human trafficking exploit people in all nations, cities and neighborhoods, even in ours. Why address boys and men? Men create the bulk of the demand while the traffickers supply human lives. This workshop will help define the supply, and clarify the demand created by ordinary men, often under the illusion that there are no victims involved.

This workshop is for men and boys only.

Modern Day Slavery in the Field, Factory, Home

Farm, factory, and domestic workers suffer injustice, exploited by wage theft, inhumane treatment and working conditions, and violation of human rights. Survivors and witnesses will share their stories. How can one be actively engaged in changing oppressive systems?

Shop ‘til I Drop

How do you know that what you purchase, from clothes on your back to the food you eat to every electronic device, didn't involve the suffering of others? This session will address the key role we all play in the enslavement of workers when purchasing goods and services.

Students Speak Out!

This student-led session will present human trafficking from the perspective of youth; describe how human trafficking is addressed in school curriculum; and suggest innovative approaches teenagers can initiate in responding to the crime of the 21st century - slavery.
