




Feast of St. Joseph

Opening Prayer: *Joseph, by the work of your hands and the sweat of your brow, you supported Jesus and Mary. Teach us to work as you did, with patience and perseverance, for God and for those whom God has given us to support. Teach us to see in our co-workers the Christ who desires to be in them, that we may always be charitable and forbearing towards all. Grant us to look upon work with the eyes of faith, so that we recognize in it our share in God's own creative activity and so take pride in it. When it is pleasant and productive, remind us to give thanks to God for it. And when it is burdensome, teach us to offer it to God for the good of others.*

Reading: Mt. 1: 18-25

“Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus. . . When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took Mary home as his wife.

Reflection: *Joseph, you entered into the mystery of God's unfolding love. Your tender compassion, heartfelt mercy and great love toward Mary and Jesus reveal God's glory. You allowed the Merciful One to flow through your daily life. You experienced doubt, confusion, poverty and oppression. Yet you trusted God's mercy, remained faithful, and were grounded in God's unconditional love. Pray for us and for our world that in the midst of injustice, violence, and difficulties we may be constant witnesses to God's mercy and great love. Amen.*

Reading: Colossians: 3

May the peace of Christ reign in your hearts, because it is for this that you were called together as parts of one body. Always be thankful. . . Let every detail of your lives—words, actions, decisions be done in the name of Christ and giving thanks to God through Christ. . . whatever your work is, put your whole heart into it for whatever you do, it is for God!
